14th Annual <u>Blue Jeans Ball</u> Gala Will Fund Life Changing Meals for Thousands of Washington Area Neighbors

Meet Lisa Messerschmidt, whose life was changed by the Blue Jeans Ball. With a parent who needed care and no sibling to rely on for help, she had to leave work and rely on her husband's salary alone. When he then lost his job due to the government shutdown, they couldn't pay their bills, had their car repossessed, and their credit crashed.

Lisa spent the next couple of years at the mercy of others, at times living without heat, running water, medical care, or, very often, food. Enter her neighborhood nonprofit, supplied with food by the Capital Area Food Bank. They provided her family with the training and resources needed to get back on their feet – starting with vegetables, fruit and other ingredients to cook with. In Lisa's words, "having food on the table made everything else seem possible." The Capital Area Food Bank helped to turn crisis into stability for her family, and by attending this year's <u>Blue Jeans Ball</u>, you can do the same for others.
