Giant Food to make spring ham donation to Capital Area Food Bank

Giant will deliver a total of 1,000 hams to five Feeding America food banks

What: Giant Food of Landover, Md. will donate 200 hams to the Capital Area Food Bank Thursday, March 24, at 11 a.m. This is part of Giant's contributions to five area Feeding America food banks for a total of 1,000 hams provided to help alleviate hunger across the Mid-Atlantic region. In addition to the Capital Area Food Bank, the Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank, Maryland Food Bank, Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, and Food Bank of Delaware will each receive 200 hams this week.

Annually, the Capital Area Food Bank distributes 44 million pounds of food—one third of which is fresh fruits and vegetables.
