EMPTY BOWLS EVENT TOUR CONCLUDES IN BETHESDA

Capital Area Food Bank Reveals Local Challenges to Nutrition Justice while Serving Soups from Area's Hippest Restaurants

What:

Local pottery artists, businesses, restaurants and people who care about universal access to healthy food will come together for the third and final installment of the Capital Area Food Bank's lunchtime event series *Empty Bowls* on November 4, 2015. For a minimum donation of \$35, guests will savor delicious soups, breads and desserts and leave with unique, handcrafted bowls donated by local artists. Guests keep their bowls as a reminder of how they helped fill empty bowls in the community. All proceeds from the sale of the art bowls go directly to the CAFB. In late October, the event tour made two other stops in the District and Northern Virginia, where the food bank operates in addition to the Maryland suburbs. Last year, the Capital Area Food Bank provided 42 million pounds of food to children, seniors and families in the Washington metro area, through 444 food assistance partner non-profits.
