## EMPTY BOWLS EVENT TOUR COMMENCES IN DUPONT CIRCLE

Capital Area Food Bank Reveals Local Challenges to Nutrition Justice while Serving Soups from Area's Hippest Restaurants

What:

Local pottery artists, businesses, restaurants and people who care about universal access to healthy food will kick off the Capital Area Food Bank's lunchtime event series *Empty Bowls* October 21, 2015. For a minimum donation of \$35, guests will savor delicious soups and bread sand leave with unique, handcrafted bowls donated by local artists. Guests keep their bowls as a reminder of how they helped fill empty bowls in the community. All proceeds from the sale of the art bowls go directly to the CAFB. There will be two further events in this series in the Virginia and Maryland suburbs, the two areas where the CAFB operates in addition to the District of Columbia. Last year, the Capital Area Food Bank provided 42 million pounds of food to children, seniors and families in the Washington metro area, through 444 food assistance partner non-profits.
