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RENT-A-CENTER DONATES \$20,000 AND 10 FREEZERS TO CAPITAL AREA FOOD BANK

Donation is part of \$250,000 earmarked for 11 US food banks

What: Rent-A-Center will donate \$20,000 to the Capital Area Food Bank, in addition to
