CAPITAL AREA FOOD BANK PARTICIPATES IN THE CHILD AND ADULT CARE FOOD PROGRAM

Funded by US Department of Agriculture

Washington, DC, October 20 – Following a long tradition, the Capital Area Food Bank announced that it will once again provide a feeding program to children and adults throughout the Washington metro area. The Child and Adult Care Food Program, for which the food bank will be an acting program sponsor, is funded by the US Deptment of Agriculture.

More than 530,700 people in the Washington metro region, 12 percent of the area's population, turn to food pantries and meal service programs to feed themselves and their families, according to the *Hunger in America 2014* study released by the Capital Area Food Bank and Feeding America.

The same meals will be available to all enrolled participants regardless of race, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin. There is no discrimination in admissions policy, meal service, or the use of facilities.

Eligibility for free or reduced-price meal reimbursement is based on the following annual income eligibility guidelines effective from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015.

The Capital Area Food Bank is the largest hunger relief organization in the Washington metro area serving over 530,700 people through direct food distribution programs and a network of 500 partner agencies. This year, the Capital Area Food Bank distributed 42 million pounds of food – the equivalent of 35 million meals – including 17.5 million pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables. A member of Feeding America, CAFB takes a comprehensive approach to addressing hunger by increasing access to nutritious food, initiating change through skill-building and advocacy, and creating sustainability with outreach and training for those at risk of hunger.
