BrightFarms to Deliver Fresh, Local Greens to Capital Area Food Bank

Donation will provide access to nourishment for 12% of Washington area residents

- WHAT: BrightFarms, a startup creating the first national brand of local produce, will donate 24 pallets of fresh arugula, spring mix and lettuce greens to the Capital Area Food Bank (CAFB), on Friday, August 5th. Sourced directly from the 150,000 square-foot BrightFarms Capitol Greenhouse in Elkwood, VA, this donation continues a long-term relationship with CAFB aimed at providing DC residents in need with access to fresh, local greens. The support of BrightFarms deepens the food bank's partnership with Giant Foods--the exclusive Washington-area grocery retailer of BrightFarms produce--which the CAFB announced last month would be named its first Retailer for Wellness.

- BrightFarms operational staff will deliver the donation in a Brightfarms truck; Capital Area Food Bank WHO: staff will be on hand to receive the donation and answer questions.
- WHY: Nearly half of the 540,000 residents served by the food bank have high blood pressure or live with someone who does, and another quarter are diabetic or living with a diabetic. The CAFB is committed to providing a balanced offering of foods to those it reaches, contributing to community wellness.
