
MULTIJURISDICTIONAL

- Increase inter-programmatic utilization of the social safety net
- Incorporate food security metrics into agency, county, and comprehensive planning
- Expand or create the Earned Income Tax Credit
- Enhance SNAP
- Emphasize use of local agriculture in food security efforts



FEDERAL

- Modernize SNAP eligibility standards
- Expand WIC eligibility to age six
- Improve client, agency, and food bank experience through TEFAP
- Permanently enact the Child Tax Credit





DC

- Increase grocery store access in Wards 5, 7, and 8
- Give SNAP a raise
- Pass the No Senior Hungry Omnibus Amendment Act of 2021



STATE



- Enact the Farm to Food Security Act (HB 147 / SB0121)
- Increase the minimum SNAP benefit and lower the age threshold to reach more seniors
- Create a Maryland Health Equity Fund

VIRGINIA

- Increase the minimum SNAP benefit
- Pass Dillon legislation to allow localities in Commonwealth to create local EITC
- Amend the EITC to ensure refundability
- Continue funding the Virginia Agriculture Food Assistance Program

LOCAL

- Establish Stand-up and Deliver program for long-term
- Create a county-level Earned Income Tax Credit



- Create a workload or full-time position dedicated to leveraging federal social safety net benefits
- Make permanent the Working Families Income Supplement Expansion to ITIN Filers

 Request Dillon legislation to allow localities in Commonwealth to create local Earned Income Tax Credit
